#### Armed Robbery

On 8/8, officers responded to a store on Christy St after an employee (victim) reported having been robbed at gunpoint. The victim saw the subject place merchandise in a backpack and attempted to apprehend him. The subject resisted and pointed a gun at the victim, leaving with products from the store. This case remains under investigation. #230808039

On 8/14, officers responded to a massage parlor on Warm Springs Blvd that had been robbed by a subject with a firearm. The subject pointed a gun at the employee at the front desk and demanded money, then fled on foot with cash before officers arrived. This case remains under investigation. #230814043

#### Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On 8/10, officers responded to a victim on Eugene St who had been attacked by two subjects armed with a knife and a gun. The subjects had broken the windows of the victim's RV, and when she confronted them, they held a knife to her and pointed a gun at her. They fled prior to police arrival, but officers located the address where the subjects' vehicle was registered. After arriving at that address, officers arrested two adult subjects, one out of Fremont and the other out of Oakland. #230810001

On 8/14, officers responded to a victim who had been struck on the head with a beer bottle by a subject at Quarry Lakes. The crime was determined to have happened in East Bay Regional Park District Police jurisdiction. Prior to their arrival, officers found the subject attempting to flee and detained him. The investigation was turned over to EBRP Police, who later arrested the subject. #230814042

#### **Bomb Threat/Swatting Call**

On 8/11, officers responded to the Beth Torah Jewish Temple at 42000 Paseo Padre Pkwy regarding a bomb threat. Officers calmly evacuated the congregation and initiated a thorough search of the facilities and surrounding property. No suspicious devices were located, and no suspicious persons were seen in the area. Temple officials advised they were previously made aware of similar hoaxes occurring at other synagogues in California. #230811035

## **Criminal Threats**

On 8/13, an employee of a manufacturing business on Industrial Dr reported that he had returned to his vehicle to find his dog missing. A witness told the victim he had seen someone taking things from his car, and the victim eventually found a subject who matched the description given by the witness. The subject denied stealing the victim's dog and threatened to shoot the victim if he called the police. This case remains under investigation. #230813022

#### **Firearm Brandishing**

On 8/11, officers responded to Fremont Blvd and London Common after a victim reported that a subject had brandished a handgun at her and another victim following an apparent road rage incident. The subject fled prior to police arrival. #230811034

#### **Major Injury Collision**

On 8/8, a motorcyclist suffered major injuries after a collision at Warm Springs Blvd and Tom Blalock St. He was transported to a regional hospital for treatment. This case remains under investigation. #230808037

#### **Mental Health Evaluation Hold**

On 8/11, officers responded to a report of a subject who had abandoned a baby atop a dirt mound on Mission Blvd and Niles Blvd. The reporting party had taken custody of the baby while officers were en route. Officers located and detained the subject, as she was displaying signs of a mental health crisis. The baby was not injured and was evaluated by Fremont Fire Department and emergency medical services. The baby was transported to a local hospital for further evaluation, and the subject was placed on a hold for mental health evaluation. #230811006

## **Traffic Injury Collision**

On 8/13, a vehicle struck two pedestrians in a slow-speed collision in the Niles District. With Fremont Fire Department, officers responded and began providing medical care to both pedestrians. The pedestrians were transported to an area hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The driver of the vehicle remained at the scene and is cooperating with the investigation. This case remains under investigation. #230813009
