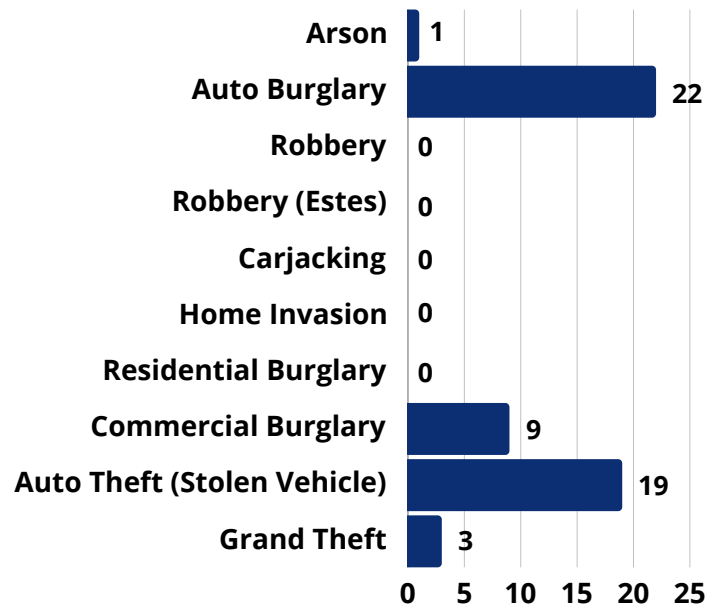

Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On 5/1, several juveniles from a high school on Fremont Blvd were fighting near a convenience store on Central Ave. During the altercation, one juvenile subject hit a juvenile on the head with a glass bottle and brandished a knife at another juvenile. Officers responded to the subject's residence and contacted his mother with a Notice to Appear. #240501030

Auto Burglary

On 5/6, two subjects attempted to burglarize a mail truck on Wyatt Ln. The subjects stole approximately 20 packages. This case remains under investigation. #240506021

Brandishing

On 5/1, a resident on Lenelle Ct confronted a subject who was stealing plants and checking door handles in the neighborhood. The subject threatened the resident, brandishing what appeared to be a handgun, then walked away with a shopping cart. Officers arrived and arrested the subject. The firearm in question turned out to be a metal lighter. #240501032

The driver remained at the scene initially but eventually fled into a nearby motorhome. The subject's vehicle had stolen license plates and another pair of stolen license plates in the trunk. Outside Assist

On 4/30, a nearby police department requested assistance for a homicide suspect in their city. The subject broke into an occupied home and barricaded himself after the occupants fled. Officers responded to surround the residence and the subject eventually surrendered. #240430042

On 5/3, officers responded to a reported structure fire at a residence on the 43300 block of Grimmer Blvd. Investigation revealed that a pile of clothing was set on fire. There were matches and small lighters on the ground at various locations throughout the residence. #240503022

Shoplifting

On 5/4, officers responded to a report of shoplifting at a discount store on Skyway Ct. Two subjects shoved items into their clothing and left without paying. Before leaving, they threatened the reporting party if she were to call for police. The subjects walked into a nearby department store. Officers located both subjects, finding that one was a juvenile. The adult subject was arrested. #240504012

Suspicious Circumstances

On 5/4, officers responded to assist Fremont Fire Department with a possible structure fire at a hotel on the 34000 block of Fremont Blvd. When officers arrived, there was no active structure fire, but a subject had sustained significant burn injuries. Investigation revealed the subject may have been attempting to concoct controlled substances, which resulted in a chemical flashover. FFD installed a ventilation fan, and the subject was transported to a trauma center for care. #240504020

Unlawfully Causing a Fire

On 5/1, Federal Aviation Administration security on Central Ave advised that someone had started a fire in the field between the train tracks and their fence line. FAA said it was the second fire started that day by the same subject, who fled along the train tracks. Officers located the subject and arrested him. #240501045
