Mobile Evaluation Team (MET)

 The Mobile Evaluation Team (MET) is a co-responder team comprised of Police Officers and Clinical staff from the Human Services Department. MET provides crisis intervention, de-escalation guidance and connects individuals and families to resources to offer help and healthy outcomes for community members experiencing mental illness and/or homelessness.
