

## **Assault with a Deadly Weapon**

On 11/8, several employees of a car repair shop were outside the business when an unknown subject approached them with an axe. The subject accused the employees of sleeping with his girlfriend and threatened to kill them. The subject swung the axe at two of the employees. No injuries were sustained. One employee challenged the subject with his firearm, and the subject fled on foot. Officers searched for the subject and eventually found him emerging from a canal. Upon seeing officers, the subject fled back into the canal, but officers initiated a short foot pursuit and arrested him. #241108025

### Carjacking

On 11/8, officers responded to a report of a carjacking on the 48000 block of Fremont Blvd. The victim walked out to her vehicle and saw a subject in the driver's seat attempting to start the vehicle. The subject transferred his personal items from an adjacent parked car into the victim's vehicle. The victim tried to prevent the subject from driving away but fell and was partially run over by the vehicle as the subject drove away in it. The victim was taken to a hospital for medical evaluation, and the victim's vehicle was later recovered in a nearby city. #241108005

#### **Criminal Threats**

On 11/5, officers responded to a restaurant on Fremont Blvd regarding a subject who had threatened to shoot two victims. The victims were eating inside the restaurant when they noticed the subject staring at them through the window. When one of the victims confronted the subject, he threatened multiple times to shoot them. Officers arrived and arrested the subject. No weapon was found on the subject. #241105037

### **Resisting Arrest**

On 11/6, a business owner on Warm Springs Blvd reported that a subject had been sleeping in front of his business. The subject had been staying there repeatedly for two months and was often found with his pants down. Officers discovered the subject had outstanding warrants and contacted him. The subject became combative, but officers detained and arrested him. #241106009

### Robbery

On 11/6, officers responded to an apartment on High St where a subject had stolen an electric bicycle. The victim noticed his bicycle was stolen from his front porch and located it leaning up against a vehicle. The victim began walking the bicycle back to his apartment when a subject exited the vehicle and pepper sprayed the victim. The subject rode away on the victim's bicycle. #241106003

On 11/8, officers responded to a convenience store on Fremont Blvd regarding an attempted robbery. A subject entered the store wielding a knife and demanded that the clerk empty the register. The clerk grabbed a metal cane and told the subject to leave the business—the subject left on foot. Officers thoroughly searched the area but did not locate the subject. #241108008

#### **Unlawful Fire**

On 11/5, officers responded to an apartment complex on Pennsylvania Ave regarding a subject setting clothes on fire near the first floor of the complex. Officers arrived as the fire was still burning and extinguished it. The subject was located nearby, and officers arrested him. #241105003

### **Warrant Service**

On 11/5, officers responded to a mobile home park on Old Canyon Rd regarding a subject looking into windows. Officers contacted the subject and learned he had an outstanding warrant. Officers arrested the subject. #241105039

On 11/11, officers responded to the 39100 block of Civic Center Dr regarding a subject who was holding a blowtorch to the side of a building. The subject did not actively light a part of the structure on fire but was examining other items while holding the torch. Officers discovered multiple outstanding warrants for the subject and arrested him. #241111021
