Residential Burglary Prevention



Residential Burglary Facts

- Residential Burglary Investigations is a high priority for the Department.
- Goal is to keep residents safe and prevent property theft
- Six FPD Detectives assigned to investigate residential burglaries



Burglary Trends

- Most burglaries occur between 8am-4pm
- Suspects often attempt contact before breaking in (door knock)
- Common methods of entry :
 - Unsecured doors & windows
 - Smashing/prying of windows
 - Door kicks
- Common property taken includes :
 - Small Electronics (iPads, cell phones, laptops)
 - Jewelry
 - Firearms
 - Currency



Burglary Prevention

- Lock all doors and windows
- Lock all firearms, jewelry and valuables in a safe that is bolted to a wall or floor.
- Display alarm signs and stickers
- Install locks on all side gate access points
- Install exterior motion lights
- Invest in alarm/surveillance camera systems



Auto Burglary Prevention



Auto Burglary Facts

- Approx. \$1.26 billion in items are stolen from autos each
- Unlocked vehicles result in approx 25% of thefts
- A complete auto burglary can happen in less than 20 seconds

- Targeted Items include:
 - Sunglasses
 - · cd's
 - Laptops
 - Stereos
 - Backpacks
 - Wallets
 - iPods & iPads
 - currency



Auto Burglary Prevention

- Always park in well-lit areas
- Always place valuables in the trunk before you reach your destination.
- Always hide and conceal all accessories
- Always close all windows, lock your vehicle, and set your alarm

- Never leave valuables in sight
- Never leave your electronic items on
- Never leave vehicles unlocked or unattended for any reason
- Never store a spare key on/in your vehicle



Auto Burglary Prevention

Auto burglaries are a crime of opportunity. Don't give thieves the opportunity to make you a victim!

Remove it, Lock it or you will LOSE it



Package Theft Prevention



Package Theft Facts

- 585 million packages were delivered by UP\$ alone in December 2014.
- This year they expect 6 to 7 days to surpass 31 million packages delivered in a single day.
- Busiest week in anticipated to be 12/14-12/18 with most of these orders coming from online purchases.



Package Theft Prevention

- Install video surveillance systems
- Install a doorbell camera
- Have packages delivered to delivery company warehouse for pickup
- Time specific package delivery
- Track packages
- Use workplace as shipping address
- Request signature delivery option
- Some companies will store packages in their warehouse allowing you to coordinate a pick up time
- Check the shipping options and pick the one making the delivery most convenient for you.



Holiday Fraud Scams



The Gift Card Scam

Some of the most common include:

- Stolen before Purchase (thieves write down the number and leave the gift card, redeeming it when the card gets purchased & activated legitimately)
- 2. Tampered Packaging (thieves replace new with empty cards while leaving the packaging intact)
- 3. Secondary Markets QuiBids (on-line (sellers ask for payment in gift cards and then never send the item purchased)









ATM Skimming



- Hidden electronics are used to steal personal information from the card.
- The second part involves recording your PIN
- Chip and PinTechnologies (Pros and Cons)



Online Sales

- Be a cautious online shopper.
- Do NOT click on unknown banner ads.
- Be leery of your friends?
- Remember, if it is too good to be true, then it is.
