




Fremont Police Week In Review

July 30 -August 5, 2020

Commercial Burglaries

Between 4:00 PM on August 4, 2020, and 8:30 AM on August 5, 2020, unknown suspect(s) broke the front window to a jewelry store located in the 37000 block of Niles Blvd. Loss was jewelry. No video surveillance was located at the time of the initial report.

At 7:00 AM on August 5, 2020, officers responded to the YMCA portable at Grimmer Elementary School on the report that it had been vandalized and items were missing. Entry was made through a window and it's undetermined when the burglary occurred. Loss reported was electronics and computer equipment.

At 2:52 AM, on August 5, 2020, a reporting party from Beverages and More called to report an alarm activation. Officers responded and found forced entry into the building. Upon entering, they found that a large object had been used to break into a scotch and champagne display case. No suspect information at this time.

Outside Assist

On August 4, 2020, Hayward PD called to request assistance locating a missing 79-year-old man who had a serious medical condition. Hayward PD advised that the male often drove to Lake Elizabeth and walked the perimeter. Several officers searched the area and located the man. He was reunited with family.

Residential Burglary

At 10:54 AM on August 4, 2020, a reporting party called dispatch and advised two males were attempting to open his front door (Tanager Dr.) and had cut off his lock box. The reporting party confronted the suspects and they fled. The suspects were described as a white male adult, mid 20's, 5'10" 190 pounds wearing a white t-shirt, black mask and an unknown race adult male.

Vandalism

On July 30, 2020 at 3:51 PM, officers were dispatched to a felony vandalism report on Carol Ave regarding a man using a machete to scratch a vehicle. Officers located the suspect, Jeff Odell, 28 year old Fremont transient, who had been arrested twice in the past two days. Upon seeing officers, he immediately fled. Odell was not initially located and will be arrested at a later time.

On August 1, 2020, Officers were dispatched to Kidango Childcare on Isle Royal on the report of a fire alarm going off. It was reported that two juvenile boys had jumped the fence moments before the alarm started to sound. Fremont Fire responded and discovered the building had been extensively vandalized. Case is being investigated.

Attempted Assault with a Deadly Weapon

On August 1, 2020, the reporting party called to report his roommate, Davee Chia 33 year old female, attempted to cut him with a knife. Officers responded and spoke with the reporting party, who was not injured. The suspect had barricaded herself in her room inside of the residence. Officers attempted to talk with the suspect and when she refused, both the Officers and the reporting party left the area. The investigation was forwarded to the District Attorney's office for charging. On August 3, 2020, Chia returned to residence and was served an Emergency Protective Order to stay away from residence and roommate. On August 4, 2020, Chia returned to residence and was arrested for violating the restraining order.

Petty Theft

On July 31, 2020, a package containing a Lenovo laptop was taken from reporting party's porch. Reporting party provided video surveillance of the incident. Case is being investigated.

Garage Burglary

On August 2, 2020, a neighbor in the 48800 block of Judie Way witnesses a person enter a garage and steal a bicycle. The good neighbor and his son follow the suspect and direct officers until they could arrive and detain the suspect with the stolen bicycle. Dennis Aquino, 40-year-old Fremont Transient, was arrested for the burglary and transported to Santa Rita Jail.

Felony Hit and Run

On July 31, 2020, at 9:46 PM, officers were dispatched to the area of Fremont Boulevard and Capitol Avenue regarding a major injury hit and run collision. Two young adult women ran into lanes of traffic on Fremont Boulevard to assist a dog who had entered the roadway. While the dog was under a stopped vehicle, silver sedan struck one of the women, causing serious injury. The victim was transported to a trauma center with major injuries. The suspect vehicle was last seen traveling east on Capitol Avenue at a high rate of speed. Traffic investigators documented the incident and are following up on the case.

Robbery Cases

At approximately 10 PM on August 3, 2020, officers responded to Grand Lake Drive on the report of a battery call after several callers reported a male victim lying on the ground, after being attacked by two suspects. The victim walked home before units arrived on scene and was transported to a trauma center. He was later released after being treated for a head injury. Two juveniles were detained near the crime scene and issued a Notice to Appear (NTA) for robbery concluding the officer's investigation at the scene. Crimes Against Persons Detectives are following up on this case.

On July 31, 2020 at 10:31 AM, a suspect passed a note to a bank teller, in the 41300 block of Fremont Blvd. (Wells Fargo) demanding cash. Before the suspect received the cash, the suspect walked out of the bank. The suspect, identified as Martin Pitts, 40-year-old Fremont transient, was located by officers near the front entrance. He was arrested and booked into Santa Rita Jail for robbery.
