

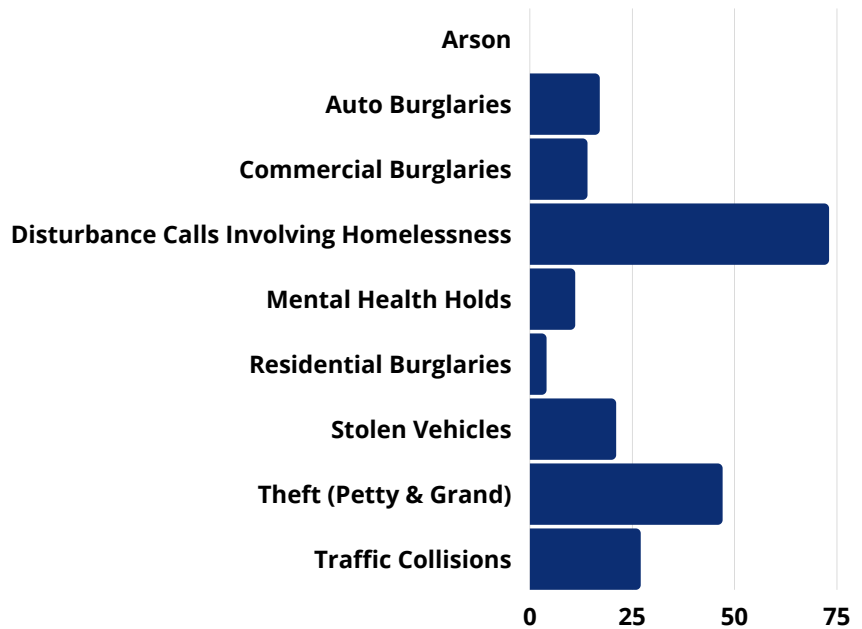

Brandishing A Weapon

On 10/26/20 a brandishing of a handgun occurred on the 48000 block of Arcadian St. At approximately 5:10 a.m. a victim noticed three people by his neighbor's Toyota Prius. One person noticed the victim watching them at which point the person pulled a handgun out of his waistband. The victim put his hands up in fear; the three people ultimately took the catalytic converter off the Prius and fled in a black SUV. #201026004

On 10/23/20 an Estes robbery occurred at Target at the Hub. A man entered the store and was in the process of stealing a jacket when he was confronted by loss prevention. The man pulled out a box cutter and attempted to stab the victim. The man fled the scene but was located and identified. Ravon Taylor (25) homeless out of Fremont was arrested. Target Security has had nine separate incidents with Taylor in the month of October. Taylor has been arrested, cited or detained for crimes by Fremont PD twelve times this year. #201023013
