


Fremont Police Week In Review

Auto Burglary

On 01/15 a victim arrived home on Embassy Common at approximately 1:00 pm when a man approached the passenger side window of her vehicle. The man broke the window and stole her purse from the front seat. The victim had just returned from Fremont Bank, 3909 Decoto Rd. #210115013

Commercial Burglary

On 01/13 officers responded to a commercial burglary at Dino's, 40800 Fremont Blvd. The front and rear door of the business was broken into. A cash register from the business was later located in a parking lot on Fremont Blvd and Grimmer Blvd. #210113017

Indecent Exposure

On 01/12 a victim waved down officers after seeing a man in the area of Grimmer Blvd and Fremont Blvd trying to open car door handles; the man proceeded to pull his pants down and began masturbating in public. Michael Abreu (60) out of Fremont was identified and arrested. #210112034

Robbery

On 01/13 a robbery occurred at 7-11, 35015 Fremont Blvd. A man walked around the counter and pulled a gun on the clerk demanding money. The clerk was uninjured. #210114001

On 01/14 a robbery occurred at Big 5, 3820 Mowry Ave. A man entered the store walked to the gun counter, jumped over it and climbed up a ladder to grab a portable speaker. When confronted the man threatened to pepper spray the employees. An employee tried to keep the man in the store while police responded, the man then pushed the employee out of the way. The man fled the store with stolen property. Ulysses Ayala (25) homeless out of Fremont. was identified and arrested. #210114024

On 01/13 a robbery occurred outside Fremont Bank, 46635 Mission Blvd. The victim was inside her vehicle when a man tapped on her passenger window. The man proceeded to shatter the window and steal the victims purse as she tried to hold onto it. The victim sustained abrasions to her hand. #210113027
