


Fremont Police Week In Review

Arson

On 11/23 at 9:54 p.m. two garbage cans were lit on fire at Irvington High School, 41800 Blacow Rd. Witnesses observed a male suspect start one of the fires and flee on foot towards Irvington Park. #211123054

Brandishing Weapon

On 11/28 at approximately 3:28 a.m. a brandishing weapon incident occurred at the A-1 Quik Stop, 3860 Lake Arrowhead Ave. Victim was sitting in his vehicle when a vehicle pulled up next to him. A male suspect got out of the vehicle, pointed a handgun at the victim and proceeded to ask what he was looking at before fleeing the scene. #211128005

Commercial Burglary

Between 11/22 and 11/23 a commercial burglary occurred at Envy U Beauty Salon, 47948 Warm Springs Blvd. Suspect(s) used a rock to shatter a glass door and removed items. #211123008

Grand Theft

Indecent Exposure
