Auto Burglary

Between 1/16 and 1/17, officers responded to approximately 63 auto burglary reports in the areas of Carol Ave, Roberts Ave, Trenouth St, Irvington Ave, and Red Hawk Cir.

Commercial Burglary

Robbery

On 1/11 at approximately 5:42 p.m. an Estes robbery occurred at Safeway, 39100 Argonaut Wy. Two suspects left the store with hundreds of dollars' worth of items without paying for them. The store's Loss Prevention employee confronted the suspects and in the process was pushed by one of the suspects. Newark Police located the vehicle in their city at the EZ 8 Motel. The suspects were located, and the loss was recovered. Dustin Rorie (35) and Rosa Nava (22) both homeless out of Fremont were arrested. #220111030
