

Fremont Police Week In Review

March 20, 2022 - March 27, 2022

On 03/20, a patrol officer conducted a traffic stop and asked the driver for registration. The driver opened the glove box and a loaded handgun fell to the floorboard. The occupants were detained and the driver was arrested for possession of a

loaded firearm.



On 03/24, Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR's) alerted officers to a stolen vehicle on Auto Mall Pkwy. Officers located the vehicle and conducted an enforcement stop. One occupant was arrested for possession of the stolen vehicle, possession of methamphetamine, and possession of heroin.

On 03/26, patrol was dispatched to a suspicious subject knocking on the door of a residence. As officers were responding, the suspect jumped into the yard of the residence and attempted to force entry inside while the occupants were screaming. Officers arrived shortly after and confronted the suspect who refused to comply. A K9 was deployed and the suspect was arrested.

On 03/27, a patrol officer conducted a traffic stop on a suspicious vehicle and conducted a search of the 2 occupants. The officer located 3 handguns, loaded magazines, high-capacity "drum" magazines, boxes of ammunition, and a large amount of marijuana. The driver was arrested and a follow up search of the suspect's residence was conducted by Gun Violence Task Force personnel.
