


# Fremont Police Week In Review

#### Arson

On 4/20 at approximately 4:40 p.m. officers responded to reports of a possible arson at Kennedy High School, 39999 Blacow Rd. A male suspect lit several small fires around campus and was reported to be walking around holding a stick. The suspect was located and confirmed he had started the fires. The suspect was found to be on parole and was also in possession of a controlled substance. Marquis Byrd (37) homeless out of Fremont was arrested. #220420042

## **Commercial Burglary**

On 4/20 at approximately 4:51 a.m. a commercial burglary occurred at Harbor Freight, 5101 Mowry Ave. An employee received a call from the alarm company, responded to the business, and discovered the front door was open. Officers arrived on scene and confirmed a burglary had occurred. Two suspects were captured on video surveillance loading shopping carts with merchandise. #220420007

# **Indecent Exposure**

# **Firearm**

# Robbery

The suspect was tased and pepper sprayed by security before leaving the store on foot. Officers located the suspect a few blocks away. #### **Theft**
