


# Fremont Police Week In Review

# **Assault with a Deadly Weapon**

On 5/14 at approximately 1:11 a.m. an assault with a deadly weapon occurred outside of California Billiards, 40510 Albrae St. A group of patrons got into an argument with another group outside of the business and shots were fired by involved parties before fleeing the scene. Detectives are following up. #220514005

### **Auto Burglary**

On 5/16 between 6:45 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. two auto burglaries occurred in the parking lot of Spin A Yarn, 45915 Warm Springs Blvd. Suspect(s) shattered vehicle windows and removed items. #220516053 & #220516055

#### **Commercial Burglary**

On 5/14 at approximately 10:24 a.m. officers responded to a report of an in-progress commercial burglary at Dream Tech Computers, 40950 Encyclopedia Cir. Victim was inside of the business when a male suspect began pulling at a boarded up window. Officers quickly arrived on scene and located the suspect. ## **Residential Burglary**

On 5/10 at approximately 9:15 a.m. a residential burglary occurred on Presidio Way. Victim was home when an unknown person knocked on his front door and window. The victim ignored it and approximately thirty minutes later, the suspect returned and began rattling the front door handle. The suspect proceeded to force entry to a side door and enter the victim's residence. The victim was able to call police and the suspect proceeded to flee the scene after seeing the victim. #220510020

On 5/13 at approximately 12:50 p.m. a residential burglary attempt occurred on Pardee Ave. Victim was home when she heard a loud noise and a male's voice yell "Go". The victim proceeded to investigate where the noise was coming from and discovered the rear sliding door shattered and saw movement in the backyard. It appeared the suspect(s) did not make entry and quickly fled the backyard upon the victim's presence. #220513012
