


# Fremont Police Week In Review

July 5, 2022 - July 11, 2022



### Auto Burglary

On 7/7, officers responded to a report of a possible active auto burglary on Enterprise Street. The reporting party was watching live security camera footage and saw several subjects appeared to be loading items from a van into a truck. Officers arrived and saw one vehicle driving away, and three suspects fleeing on foot. One suspect was stopped and found to be in possession of a controlled substance. One adult suspect out of San Ramon was arrested. The case remains under investigation. #220707002

### **Commercial Burglary**

On 7/6, officers received report of a commercial burglary at a storage facility that likely took place between 10:00 p.m. on 7/4 and 6:00 a.m. on 7/5. Unknown suspect(s) gained entry to the property by using pallets to climb over a concreate wall and cut the razor wire along the top of the wall. Catalytic converters were stolen from RVs being stored on the property. At this time it is unknown if other items were stolen. There is no video surveillance or suspect description available. The case remains under investigation. #220706027

### **Evading Police**

On 7/10, officers attempted a traffic stop on a vehicle near Auto Mall Pkway and Osgood Rd. The vehicle fled and immediately crashed. The driver/suspect fled on foot and was last seen running southbound on 680. A search of the area was conducted with drone and K-9 deployment. While the suspect was not located, officers were able to identify the suspect. A stolen handgun was located inside the suspect vehicle. At this time an arrest warrant for the suspect is in the process of being seek. #220710003

### Grand Theft

On 7/6, officers received reports of a grand theft that occurred at a discount warehouse. While shopping, an unknown suspect approached the victims to distract them, while another unknown suspect took one of the victim's purse from their shopping cart. The victim had \$5,000 cash in the purse. The case remains under investigation. #220706029

On 7/9, officers responded to a report of a company's security guard stealing merchandise from the company's shipping vehicles. One suspect is estimated to have stolen over \$4,000 worth of electronics. Officers arrested the suspect and recovered some of the stolen items. One adult suspect out of San Jose was arrested. #220709003

### Robbery

On 7/8, a victim reported being approached by three unknown suspects at his apartment complex parking lot, and one was armed with a knife. The suspects demanded the victim's cell phone, which the victim gave to the suspects. The suspects returned the phone and demanded the victim's wallet. The victim informed the suspects that the wallet is in the apartment. The suspects followed the victim to the apartment and waited outside, while the victim retrieved the wallet and brought it outside to the suspects. The suspects then demanded the victim's car keys. The victim went back to the apartment, locked the door, and called the police. Officers immediately responded to the area and set up a perimeter, but no suspects were located. The case remains under investigation. #220706029

#### Stolen Vehicle/Vehicle Recovery

On 7/5, officers responded to a report of a car being stolen and the victim was tracing the location of the vehicle via a tracking device. The tracking device indicated the location of the vehicle in the area of Industrial Place. Officers located the unoccupied stolen vehicle but no suspects were located. The case remains under investigation. #220705004

On 7/6, a vehicle stolen from the previous day was captured on an automatic license plate reader (ALPR). Officers located the vehicle and an enforcement stop was conducted. One adult suspect out of Antioch was arrested. #220705030

On 7/7, a stolen vehicle was captured on an automatic license plate reader (ALPR). Officers located the vehicle and an enforcement stop was conducted. One adult suspect was arrested. #220707025

On 7/8, a stolen vehicle was spotted by officers near the area of Fremont Blvd. and Central Ave. Officers located vehicle and the driver. One adult suspect out of Union City was arrested. #220708003

On 7/9, a stolen vehicle was captured on an automatic license plate reader (ALPR). Officers located vehicle and the driver. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #220709011
