
Review Highlights

- City of Fremont
 - 2nd largest city in the Bay Area, 90 square miles
 - 4th most populous city in the Bay Area, population 250,000+
- Review of Crime Statistics, highlighting major community concerns:
 - Gun Violence/Shootings

Shooting Incidents and Firearm Arrests






- Violent Crime is our Top Priority
 - Goal is to investigate & reduce shootings and gun crimes
 - Focus on quick apprehension to prevent additional incidents
 - In 2021, FPD made 20 arrests of priority subjects identified by Gun Violence Reduction Team (GVRT)
 - In 2022, we have made 32 firearms related arrests*
- Planned Gun Buyback Program in November 2022



Homicide & Serious Assaults






- Three homicides last year (2021) each resolved by arrest
- In 2022, one resolved by arrest, one a suspect is identified with charges filed and the third is an active and ongoing investigation


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
- Key is quick response, thorough investigation and subsequent apprehension

Burglaries








- High visibility patrols as deterrent in identified hotspots

Auto Theft





Grand Thefts and Catalytic Converters Thefts





- Grand theft increase attributed to national and regional trend of catalytic converter thefts
- Tackling catalytic converter thefts
 - Regional information sharing
 - In July 2022, detectives investigated a recycler who has since ceased operations
- State Legislation: Assembly Bill 1740 - Catalytic converters

Sideshow Activity**



- Traffic & Patrol teams deployed to key hotspots during peak hours of activity based on analysis
- Focus on regional information sharing to deter high profile events occurring in the city
- Ordinance to prohibit spectators at sideshow activities

- Traffic/Patrol enforcement deployed to key hotspots based on analysis

The City is already taking significant steps to address this issue.



The Police Department is a partner in the overall homelessness issue in that we have a unique role: part education and part enforcement.



We do not criminalize or take enforcement action merely for being homeless.



We take enforcement action for violations of law, negative behaviors, and FMC violations.



We need to continue to educate the public about what is a crime, what we can and can't do, and when they see something, report it.








Homeless Disturbance (415H) Calls for Service & 5150 Reports

- From 2019 2021, Homeless Disturbance calls for service account for about 3% of total calls for service
- 5150 (Mental Health Evaluation) reports decrease attributed to enhanced officer training & increased intervention by Mobile Evaluation Team (MET) on repeat clients



Hate Crimes and Hate Incidents




- A hate crime is a crime against a person, group, or property
 motivated by the victim's real or perceived protected social group
 (disability, gender, nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual
 orientation, and/or association with a person or group with one or
 more of these actual or perceived characteristics)
- Hate crimes are serious crimes that may result in imprisonment or jail time



- A **hate incident** is an action or behavior motivated by hate but which, for one or more reasons, is not a crime
 - name-calling/insults
 - displaying hate material on own property
 - posting hate material that does not result in property damage
 - distribution of materials with hate message in public areas
- The U.S. Constitution allows hate speech as long as it does not interfere with the civil rights of others

- 2021 cases reported to Department of Justice (DOJ):
 - Anti-religion (3)
 - Anti-race (4)
- 2022 cases (Jan Jun):
 - Anti religion (0)
 - Anti-race (4)
