


Fremont Police Week In Review

Ascertain a Problem/Theft

On 10/18, officers responded to a supermarket on Niles Blvd to a report of the owner not feeling well after chasing a theft suspect out of the store. Upon arrival, officers located the suspect fleeing the area on foot and detained him. Officers determined that the owner confronted the suspect after stealing several bottles of alcohol from the business. During the confrontation, the suspect threw the bottles of alcohol at the owner in an attempt to escape. The owner refused medical attention. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221018012

Battery

On 10/23, officers responded to Carnation Way to a family battery to which the suspect had been assaulting other family members. The victim, the suspect's 74-year-old mother, complained of pain and stated the suspect threatened to harm her and other family members. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221023002

Criminal Threats

On 10/19, officers responded to a store on Albrae St; for a person bleeding outside the store and yelling for help. Officers arrived and located an adult (suspect) with a significant cut to his lower leg. The suspect had fallen on some scissors at an encampment behind the business. Officers provided medical attention and placed the suspect in an ambulance for transport to a nearby hospital. While en route to the hospital, ambulance personnel requested police assistance because the suspect became violent. Officers detained the suspect, who repeatedly threatened to hurt the responders and their families. One adult suspect out of Fremont was ultimately arrested. #221019016

DUI Arrest

On 10/21, officers responded to an automobile manufacturing plant on Fremont Blvd after security advised that a vehicle had crashed into a building. Upon arrival, officers found that no collision had occurred. However, the vehicle's driver was found to be under the influence of alcohol and placed under arrest. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221021004

Felony Vehicle and Warrant Arrest

On 10/20, officers were alerted to an ALPR (automatic license plate reader) notification of a felony vehicle known for grand theft and participation in organized retail crime rings. Officers located the suspect vehicle in the vicinity of Fremont Blvd and Bidwell Drive. An enforcement stop was initiated, and the occupant complied. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested for multiple felony warrants. #221020041

Welfare Check and Warrant Arrest

On 10/21, a reporting party called 9-1-1 to report she was in a verbal argument with the father of her child. During the conversation with 9-1-1 dispatch, she tried to cancel the call. Due to welfare concerns, our officers responded to conduct a welfare check. Upon arrival, officers met with the reporting party and the suspect. Officers determined the suspect had an active warrant violating a temporary restraining order. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221021010
