

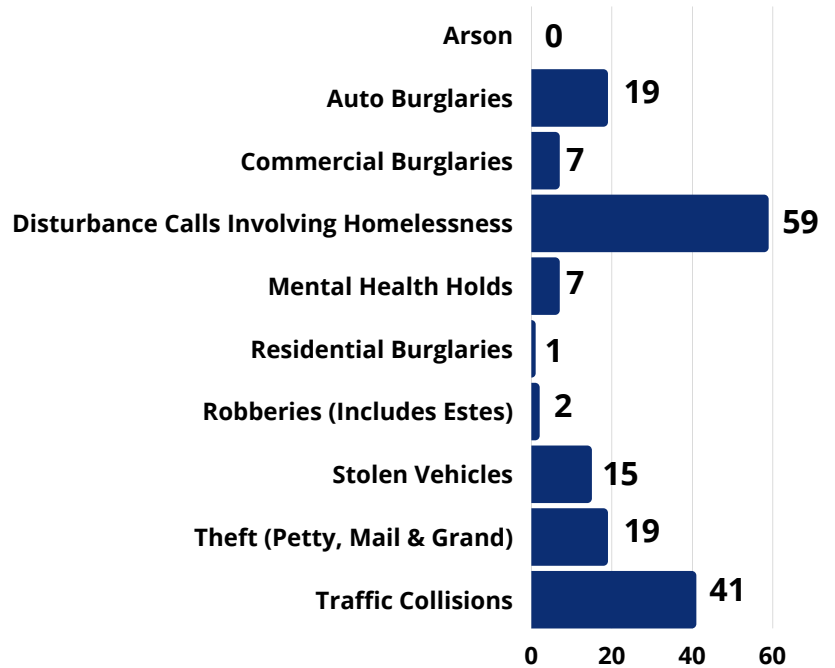


# Fremont Police Week In Review

### Commercial Burglary

On 10/25, officers responded to a commercial burglary at a business located on Woodcreek Common. Three suspects shattered a window to the business, and one of the suspects made entry and tampered with a television. All three suspects later fled on bicycles. Officers arrived and located one of the suspects in the area. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested. #221025017

### DUI

On 10/28, officers responded to a vehicle collision in the 5500 block of Buchanan Place, where a vehicle collided with a parked car. Officers arrived and located the vehicle, the driver, and two children inside the vehicle. The driver was determined to be intoxicated and was arrested for DUI and child endangerment. #221028036

On 10/30, officers responded to S Grimmer Blvd and Fremont Blvd regarding a vehicle vs. motorcycle collision. Upon arrival, officers contacted the vehicle's driver and determined that the driver was intoxicated. The motorcyclist was transported to a local hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The driver was arrested for DUI causing injury. #221030018

### Mental Health Evaluation

On 10/25, officers responded to the 43000 block of Fremont Blvd to a juvenile subject armed with knives and in crisis, potentially wanting to commit self-harm. After instructing family members to evacuate, officers learned the juvenile was hearing impaired. Officers were able to help de-escalate the youth via text messaging. A community service officer who is a certified ASL interpreter was contacted and made herself available for facetime with the juvenile. The juvenile exited the home safely, where he could be evaluated. #221025024

## Reported Injury from Highway Shooting

On 10/29, officers were dispatched to a grocery store in the Warms Springs area after store employees were contacted by a subject who advised he had been shot while driving on Interstate 880. Officers arrived and attended to the subject, who had a non-life-threatening graze wound to the head. California Highway Patrol (CHP) also responded and took over the investigation. The subject was later transported to a regional medical facility. This case remains under investigation by the CHP. #221029022

## Arrests

On 10/29, officers responded to a store at the Fremont Hub, where store employees reported seeing a suspect who had shoplifted items the previous day. When officers arrived on the scene, store employees advised that the subject was loading a bag with merchandise again. The suspect was contacted and determined to have an outstanding drug-related warrant out of a nearby City. One adult suspect out of Fremont was arrested on the warrant and theft-related charges. #221029019, #221029020

On 10/30, officers conducted a traffic stop at Mowry Ave, and Farwell Dr. Officers observed multiple offenses in plain view, leading to a vehicle search. The driver (suspect) was in possession of drugs, and officers located multiple firearms in the vehicle, including one loaded with a high-capacity magazine and contraband packaged for sales. One adult suspect out of San Francisco was arrested for firearms and drug charges. #221030001

On 10/31, officers conducted a pedestrian stop in the area of Niles Blvd and Kraftile Rd. A warrant check on the pedestrian (suspect) revealed he has several active warrants for weapons-related crimes. One adult suspect out of San Leandro was arrested. #221031017
